

Mario Liverani's Publications Available in English

The great Assyriologist, archaeologist, and historian of the Ancient Near East, Mario Liverani, was recently honored with [a conference in Rome](#). He sent me a copy of his full bibliography with permission to rework and publish online as seems best. Let's just say it took me many more hours than I expected to rework his copy into a user-friendly bibliography designed for students and scholars alike.

The following select list of Liverani's monographs available in English is designed to provide a window into his wide-ranging interests, which extend from the Neolithic Revolution, the first cities in Mesopotamia, Tel Mardikh, the Middle Euphrates region, the Amarna period, Ugarit, ancient Israel, the Neo-Assyrian period, the Libyan Sahara in Garamantian times, and the history of archaeological exploration of the Near East in modern times.

Mario Liverani's 1960-1989 articles available in English

Liverani's scholarship is of salient interest to anyone interested in the history of the Ancient Near East, the origins of civilization, and the phenomena of acculturation and deculturation. Its breadth is not as quite as wide as the scholarship of [William Foxwell Albright](#), but its depth surpasses it. No one has yet to write the equivalent of Albright's *From the Stone Age to Christianity* for our day, but when it is written, Liverani's opus will serve as a key point of departure.
